


2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 54 responses




3. How well were the teachers able to communicate? 54 responses




4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 54 responses




5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 54 responses



6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 54 responses




7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.




8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.




9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.








13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.




15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process 54 responses




16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.


