### On Gerentology

It is a multidisciplinary study in the sense that it has implications in biology, medicine, physiotherapy, social work, sociology, anthropology and economics. The study helps in policy making in favour of the old. The field has increasing significance as the populations in different parts of the world have more aged members than young. It puts forth the notion of 'successful ageing', in the sense that the old ones should be able to feel satiated with where they are in their lives.

The problems faced by the old people are many. Physical issues which come with ageing are the most talked about among them. Apart from that, they face issues such as purposelessness in life, financial issues, difficulty with daily tasks, finding the right care providers, social alienation and more. Gerontology comprehensively addresses all these issues to give the old ones a better chance at enjoying the winters of their lifetime.

Successful ageing is an alien concept at least to people in our part of the world. Gerontology places significance on the health of the ageing population and their active participation in social life. Some of the developed nations who have more of the ageing population than the young, systematically apply the rubrics of Gerontology for maximum production and the wellbeing of the populace. Empowering the old to attain an optimal state of self-sufficiency can be made a part of our national policy too.

#### **Community Centres for the Old**

The Indian tradition espouses that the sons are responsible for the caring of their old parents. While this is a convenient arrangement for many, there are millions of senior citizens who are not supported by their children. There is an increasing number of old parents being abandoned or sent to old age homes. There are also innumerable cases of unhappy parents living with their adult children. As old age homes are a relatively new concept to Indians, certain social stigma is associated with it. Here lies the need to redefine our old age homes.

#### **Upskilling the Old**

The government can come up with plans to categorise the senior citizens who would like to be a part of the scheme. The old ones can be given training in works which require physical or intellectual skills. Since the population is increasing consistently and the production process has to level up to the demands, it would be ideal to make the senior citizens a part of the process.

#### Physical and Mental Health of the Old

Old age comes with the risk of decreased brain function due to different reasons such as changes in neurotransmitters, heredity or accumulated toxins in the brain. This in turn results in diminished cognitive skills and a lack of flexibility in situations in everyday life. Such undesirable changes in the old can be curbed with routine exercise and nutritious food. An understanding of the physical changes in the old can help both the young ones to cope with their elders and the old ones to maintain their own good health.

#### Late Bloomers in Life



# Kerala's Higher Education Sector In the Age of Artificial Intelligence: The Way Forward

Kerala, India's most literate state, ranks high in terms of education. We have seen Malayalis' influence in different regions across the globe and also in numerous domains. There's no doubt that Kerala's educational system has played a significant role in the achievement of all Malayalis.

Successive governments have made fundamental changes to Kerala's education system in consultation with educational, cultural, linguistic, and occupational experts and researchers. However, a new point of contention is whether Kerala's higher education system has been adequately revised in light of recent industry changes. In the modern era, where AI platforms such as Chat GPT, Google Bard I, and others are getting momentum, it is critical to understand the immediate improvements needed in Kerala's higher education sector.

Consider Kerala's current higher education scenario: only 43.2% of students enter higher education after completing Plus Two, according to AISHE (2020–21). In India, Kerala is first in literacy but sixth in higher education Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER). After completing Plus Two, students should have a variety of options before enrolling in degree programmes; however, the current situation in Kerala is pathetic in this regard. Most of our students do not pursue degrees other than B. A., B. Sc., B. Com., traditional engineering combinations and MBBS, because they have a limited number of available career choices. Despite the 1448 colleges Kerala has, successive governments have recurrently failed to increase the intake capacity, based on the population of the area where they're located.

Many problems can be spotted in the functioning of Kerala's universities. Inaccurate academic calendar, lack of timely syllabus revision, traditional method of examination and evaluation, political interference in academic council and boards of studies, and improper planning of semesters, examination, evaluation, and declaration of result, are just a few of the issues that contribute to a significant decrease in academic quality. The implementation of the NEP 2020 and Academic Bank of Credit are still in their early stages. Some Universities in Kerala have only recently begun to offer integrated programmes.

In addition, lack of interest in traditional courses like B. Sc. Mathematics, Physics, lack of new generation courses, and other factors are stifling our higher education sector. Kerala, without a doubt, has a shortage in availability of modern courses, Infrastructure and technologies. As a result, the new generation of students prefers to pursue higher education in foreign countries or neighbouring states.

It is still true that Kerala's successive governments had a stepmother policy towards private educational institutions. The same policy applies to foreign institutions that come to Kerala. However, the private sector plays a significant role in Kerala's higher education landscape. Although private colleges educate more than half of University students, the private sector is frequently excluded from strategic academic planning boards and other decision making bodies. When compared to other states, it appears surprising that Kerala does not provide research centres to private colleges.

A core reform in the higher education sector is required to meet the target of 50% GER in Kerala's higher education sector and to address the rising unemployment. If the concept of "India as a Vishwa Guru" is formed, Kerala will be forced to adapt to globalisation's changes. We must prepare for a significant shift by developing strategic plans and that include excellent physical budgets facilities and curriculum of international standards with new generation courses. advanced academic and environment, skill development programmes, new generation technologies, high efficiency, quality, accreditation-worthiness, institutionindustry interface, placement, and so on. Our universities should be able to create a highquality academic environment by adhering to academic calendars on time, conducting exams in a scientific manner and publishing results, and representing government and private institutions in strategic decision making.

Apart from the traditional courses, there should be facilities in Kerala for studying the huge potential areas such as artificial intelligence, machine learning, digital marketing,e-commerce, agribusiness, food processing, vertical farming, quantum computing, electrical vehicle technology, technology, sustainable management, connectivity, Solar Geoengineering, Prefab Construction, Green Construction, Climate Change, Healthcare Technology, Molecular Biology, Biomedical Science, Health Trackers, Sleep Technology, Science, E-Accounting, Block-Chain Animation Technology, Educational Technology, Space Tourism, Global Entertainment Streaming and Metaverse.

Furthermore, our universities and colleges do not adequately address entrepreneurship. Foreign universities, on the other hand, frequently place a premium on entrepreneurships/ start-ups. Our universities must take a similar approach. Such a shift could have a significant impact on the economic development of our country.


As more colleges gain autonomy under the new education policy, competition between colleges and universities will heat up. If Kerala's universities do not prepare to leave the political conflict, things will become more complicated in the future.

We must change our negative perceptions on foreign and private Universities. When it comes to attracting foreign investment, we must change our attitude towards such Universities, give them space, and equip our universities with the tools they need to compete in this sector.

Regardless of policy and political issues, we can take the lead in global education if we prepare a reengineering masterplan to revitalise the higher education sector and implement the same by ensuring decentralisation and inclusiveness. When India is on the verge of becoming a VISHWAGURU in education, we can hope that Kerala will take the lead.

### Silencing Silence: The Voices of the Silenced Victims

"Silence. Don't raise your voice, don't raise your thoughts. Be a woman, and women don't speak out loud. Hush! For, people will hear." Growing up as a girl, this was the mantra taught to each one of us. This was like a prayer, recited to us like our grandmothers whisper on the beads of their rosary.

I grew up embedded in such rules with their justification as 'it's all to protect you'. I never had questioned it and never needed to. The truth is, until and unless you're pushed out of your comfort zone, you don't question the way the world works. Not till I was forced out of my cocoon. That day, I had one of my friends come up to me and say that she wanted to talk. As soon as we were alone, she hugged me and broke down saying she was 'impure'. "I'm impure now. What will I do?" She repeated it many times. I didn't know what she was talking about. Not until she said that she was raped. I insisted on telling her parents. But she just wouldn't. She said she won't because she's scared. "Promise me you won't tell anyone. Please." I was stuck. She was fourteen and I was fifteen at that time. We were two kids, put in a situation that no one should go through.

'What would you do if you were in my place?', she asked me. Numb, I didn't have a reply to give her, not because I didn't know what I'd do, but because I knew it too well. I'd keep silent, just like she did. I was so powerless, with only a shoulder for her to lean on. 'Hush. Don't raise your voice', this very mantra for my protection held me in a chokehold. I felt constricted, stripped off a right that was lawfully mine. My very cocoon came crashing down and breaking, falling into hot water, the fibres of it unravelling, showing me the real world- the silenced world. Is this what being silenced felt like? Is that what the promised liberation felt like? Like fear? Fear to talk, fear to fight for justice, fear of being heard.

Victim blaming occurs when a victim is held partially or wholly responsible for any transgressions they had to face. Growing up bound by those unwritten rules, one forgets to think 'Whether this is the real me', or 'if that's the type of person that they want me to be'. The ideal woman written up or painted by society, especially a patriarchal one, is a woman groomed for the man. Be it her sexual history, height, weight, colour, or economic background. Is that what being a woman is? To be painted, groomed, and readied for a man? Only to be seen and not to be heard? Is silence the only worth they can plead?

The sarcastic bitter truth is that not only do we silence our daughters but also our sons. 'Conceal, don't feel. Be a man. Men do not cry', they say. Since when did having sentiments become unmanly? And why? In that case, male victims don't have it easier either. The masculine stereotype painted for generations carves and imposes a certain way of strength, resilience, and courage. They are expected to be strong enough to resist, to fight against anything that comes their way. And if they are not able to handle such a situation, they are severely bullied, ostracised, and shunned by society.

The media elevates the matter to its worst state. It is a small accusation that they drop in their headings or news piece that blames the victim indirectly. 'Women out, Partying at Night, Raped', 'Man Found Dead, Suspected Drug Deal Went Wrong': these are the headlines we come across on media. There is no need for the papers to write that the woman was out partying at night or that the man was 'suspected' to be in contact with dealers. It is such small notations that appeal to the masses and create the 'right' and 'wrong' amongst the societies.

Why blame the victim?. It was the search for the answer to this question that drove me crazy. And astonishingly, the answer chilled my blood. The tendency to blame the victim is imprinted in us from a very young age. Our society brings us up with their teachings, for example, 'don't stand so close to the railing or you will fall, like the kid in the news today, 'don't cross the road while on the phone, or you'll lose your life like the boy they showed on TV'. Our mind shifts and imbibes the idea that if we won't do 'it', we will be safe. Moreover, all those victims had it coming their way because they were all daring enough to do it'. And hence, whoever dared to do 'it', had it coming their way. They practically called it upon themselves. We rationalise everything on the same line of thought, but what we don't realise is that we regain our sense of security and safety by jeopardising the victims.

Victim blaming a topic on which we need to bring awareness among the masses. Lives can be saved by standing with the person who had to/ is going through unfair treatment. It is never the victim's fault. He/she was not asking to be hit, raped, molested, abused, assaulted, or even killed; no matter what the time, place, age, gender, or dressing was.

Blending in is easy, but how far will we blend in to fog out the miserable?

### Debate on Women's Equity

### Remedial Class at the Department of Commerce






### Quiz on Molly

### Physical Training Session for Faculty





# Case Study on Issues Faced by Consumers






### Rohith. R is the 'Poster It!' Prize Winner

കേരളത്തിൽ നടന്ന സാമൂഹിക പരിവർത്തനങ്ങൾക്കു ഏറ്റവും വലിയ ഉത്തേജനമായത് ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരു പിന്നോക്ക സമുദായത്തിന്റെ ഉന്നമനത്തിനു വേണ്ടി ചെലുത്തിയ സ്വാധീനശക്തിയായിരുന്നു. 'ഒരു ജാതി, ഒരു മതം, ഒരു ദൈവം മനുഷ്യന് എന്ന വിഖ്യാത മുദ്രാവാക്യത്തിലൂടെ മനുഷ്യ സാഹോദര്യത്തിന്റെ ഉദാത്ത മാതൃകയാണ് ഗുരു ഉയർത്തിക്കാട്ടിയത്. 'ആധുനിക കേരളത്തിന്റെ ധാർമികാടിസ്ഥാനം' എന്ന തന്റെ ലേഖനത്തിൽ ബി. രാജീവൻ കേരളീയ നവോഥാന പ്രസ്ഥാനങ്ങളിൽ ശ്രീ നാരായണഗുരു വഹിച്ച പങ്കിനെയും എസ്.എൻ.ഡി.പിയുടെ പ്രവർത്തങ്ങളെയും വിലയിരുത്തുന്നുണ്ട്. 1903 ലാണ് എസ്.എൻ.ഡി.പി സ്ഥാപിക്കപ്പെടുന്നത് . അതിനും പതിനഞ്ചു വര്ഷങ്ങള്ക്കു മുമ്പാണ് 1888 ൽ ഗുരു അരുവിപ്പുറത്തു ശിവ പ്രതിഷ്ഠ നടത്തുന്നത്. എന്നാൽ പിൽക്കാലത്തു ഈഴവ പരിഷ്കരണത്തിന്റെ മുഖമായി മാറിയ ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരുവിനെ തങ്ങളുടെ ഗുരുവായി അംഗീകരിക്കാൻ അന്നത്തെ പല ഈഴവ പ്രമാണിമാർക്കും സാധിച്ചില്ലെന്ന ഗുരുതരമായ ആരോപണമാണ് ബി. രാജീവൻ തന്റെ ലേഖനത്തിൽ ഉയർത്തിക്കാട്ടുന്നത്.

തന്റെ വാദങ്ങളെ സാധൂകരിക്കുന്നതിനായി കുറ്റിപ്പുഴ കൃഷ്ണപിള്ളയുടെ അഭിപ്രായവും ബി. രാജീവൻ പങ്കുവെക്കുന്നുണ്ട്. "1903 ൽ ആദ്യത്തെ സാമൂഹിക പരിഷ്കരണത്തിന് നേതൃത്വം കൊടുക്കുന്ന സംഘടനയായി എസ്.എൻ.ഡി.പി നിലവിൽ വന്നു. മറ്റു സമുദായ സംഘടനകളുടെ വാഗണുകളെ വലിച്ചു കൊണ്ട് പോയ എഞ്ചിനായിരുന്നു എസ്.എൻ.ഡി.പി. അത്തരത്തിൽ 1888 ലെ അരുവിപ്പുറം ശിവപ്രതിഷ്ഠ ആധുനിക കേരളത്തിന്റെ ശിലാസ്ഥാപനമായിരുന്നു. എന്നാൽ ഇതിൽ ഗുരുവിനു സ്വസമുദായത്തിൽ നിന്ന് എത്രത്തോളം പിന്തുണ ലഭിച്ചു എന്നതു ചർച്ച ചെയ്യേണ്ടിയിരിക്കുന്നു".

ജനാധിപത്യ കേരളത്തിൽ പ്രവർത്തിച്ച നവോഥാന പ്രസ്ഥാനങ്ങളുടെ ധാർമികമായ അടിത്തറയെക്കുറിച്ചുള്ള ഒരു പുനർവിചിന്തനം ഈ കാലഘട്ടത്തിൽ വളരെ പ്രസക്തമാണെന്ന് പ്രൊ. ബി. രാജീവൻ സൂചിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. നാൾ തോറും മലയാളിയുടെ ധാർമ്മിക ജീവിതം ദുര്ബലമായിക്കൊണ്ടിരിക്കുകയാണ്. അതിനു പ്രധാനകാരണം മതരാഷ്ട്രീയം ശക്തി പ്രാപിക്കുന്നതാണെന്ന നിരീക്ഷണവും ബി. രാജീവൻ പങ്കുവെക്കുന്നുണ്ട്. ഈ ഒരു ധാർമിക ജീവിതത്തിന്റെ ദുർഘടാവസ്ഥയിലാണ് ഇടത്തരക്കാരന്റെ ചിന്തകൾ ആത്മീയവൽക്കരിക്കപ്പെടുന്നത് എന്നും നാം മനസ്സിലാക്കേണ്ടതുണ്ട്.

കേരളത്തിന്റെ ജാതിഘടനയും, സാമൂഹികാവസ്ഥയും, ധർമ്മസംഹിതയും, ഭരണക്രമവും ഒരളവു വരെ ബ്രാഹ്മണ ശക്തിയിൽ അധിഷ്ഠിതമായിരുന്നു. അത്തരത്തിലുള്ള ബ്രാഹ്മണശക്തിയുടെ അടിവേരിളക്കിയ സംഭവമായിരുന്നു ശ്രീനാരായണ ഗുരുവിന്റെ അരുവിപ്പുറം പ്രതിഷ്ഠ. ഡോ. പൽപ്പുവിന്റെ ഇടപെടലുകളിലൂടെയാണ് ഗുരു കേരളത്തിലെ ജാതിവിരുദ്ധ പോരാട്ടങ്ങളുടെ നേതൃമുഖമായി കടന്നു വരുന്നത്. ഗുരുവിനെ മുൻനിർത്തി കേരളീയ സാമൂഹിക ചരിത്രത്തിൽ മറ്റുള്ളവർക്ക് ഒരു മാതൃകയാവാൻ എസ്.എൻ.ഡി.പിക്ക് സാധിച്ചത്. അതിനെ തുടർന്നാണ് മന്നത്തു പത്മനാഭന്റെ നേതൃത്വത്തിലുള്ള എൻ.എസ്.എസ് നായർ സമുദായത്തിന്റെ ഉന്നമനത്തിന് വേണ്ടി രൂപീകൃതമാവുന്നത്. ചട്ടമ്പി സ്വാമികളുടെ 'പ്രാചീന മലയാളം' എന്ന കൃതിയിൽ കേരളത്തിലെ ആദിമ നിവാസികളുടെ പാരമ്പര്യത്തെപ്പറ്റിയും നായന്മാരുടെ പാരമ്പര്യത്തെക്കുറിച്ചും സൂചിപ്പിക്കുന്നുണ്ട്. അക്കാലത്തു തന്നെ ബ്രാഹ്മണർക്കു എതിരെയുള്ള ചിന്ത ജനങ്ങളിൽ ഉടലെടുത്തിരുന്നു. മന്നത്തിന്റെ ജീവിത സ്മരണകളിൽ ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരുവിനെക്കുറിച്ചു പരാമർശമുണ്ട്.

ശ്രീനാരായഗുരുവിനെ അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ ജാതിയിൽ തന്നെ അടിച്ചിടപ്പെട്ട നവോഥാനത്തിൻറെ മുഖമായി ബി. രാജീവൻ അടയാളപ്പെടുത്തുന്നു. കേരളത്തിലെ ജാതിബോധത്തിനെതിരെ പ്രവർത്തിച്ച ഗുരുവിനെ ഈഴവരുടെ ഗുരുവായി മാത്രം അവരോധിച്ചു എന്നതായിരുന്നു ശ്രീ നാരായണ പ്രസ്ഥാനങ്ങളുടെ ഏറ്റവും വലിയ പരിമിതി എന്ന് ബി. രാജീവൻ തുറന്നടിക്കുന്നു. "ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരു കേരളത്തിൽ തുറന്ന നവോഥാനത്തിന്റെ വാതിൽ ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരുവിനെക്കൊണ്ട് തന്നെ അടപ്പിച്ചു" എന്ന് സഹോദരൻ അയ്യപ്പൻ അഭിപ്രായപ്പെട്ടത് അതുകൊണ്ടാണ്.

നാരായണീയ ദർശനങ്ങളുടെ പിൽക്കാല കാഴ്ചപ്പാടിൽ വന്ന മാറ്റത്തിന് ഒരു പ്രധാന കാരണം ശ്രീനാരായണ ധർമ്മത്തെക്കുറിച്ചുള്ള രാഷ്ട്രീയ വിശകലനങ്ങളുടെ അപര്യാപ്തതയാണ്. കേരളത്തിൽ മാത്രമല്ല ദേശീയപ്രസ്ഥാനത്തിലും ശ്രീനാരായണ ധർമ്മം അത് അർഹിക്കുന്ന തരത്തിൽ ചർച്ച ചെയ്യപ്പെട്ടില്ല.

"ജാതിഭേദം, മതദ്വേഷം

ഏതുമില്ലാതെ സർവ്വരും

സ്വദരദ്വേന വാഴുന്ന

മാതൃകാസ്ഥാനമാണിത്"

ഇത് കേവലമൊരു പ്രസ്താവന അല്ല. മറിച്ച് ഒരു നൂതനാശയത്തിന്റെ, ഒരു നൂതന ധര്മത്തിന്റെ പ്രതിഷ്ഠയായിരുന്നു അതെന്ന് വെളിപ്പെടുത്തുന്നു. അരുവിപ്പുറം ക്ഷേത്രച്ചുമരിൽ ഗുരു സ്വന്തം കൈപ്പടയിൽ എഴുതിച്ചേർത്തതാണീ വരികൾ. ഈ ധർമ്മപ്രതിഷ്ഠയുടെ രാഷ്ട്രീയവും സാംസ്കാരികവുമായ അർത്ഥതലങ്ങളിലേക്കു ഇനിയും നമ്മൾ ഇറങ്ങി ചെല്ലേണ്ടതുണ്ട് എന്നും ബി. രാജീവൻ ഓര്മപ്പെടുത്തുന്നുണ്ട്.

അന്നത്തെ തിരുവിതാംകൂർ രാജവംശവും ഭരണരീതിയും ശ്രീ പത്മനാഭദാസന്മാർ എന്ന നിലയിലായിരുന്നു. എന്നാൽ അതിനു സമാന്തരമായി ഒരു കൊളോണിയൽ ആശയവും ഇവിടെ നിലനിന്നിരുന്നു. സായിപ്പിന്റെ നിർമ്മിതിയായ ഹൈന്ദവ തിയോക്രറ്റിക് ഭരണകൂടത്തിന്റെ ധാർമികവ്യവസ്ഥയുടെ ആധികാരികതയെയാണ് അരുവിപ്പുറം പ്രതിഷ്ഠയിലൂടെ ശ്രീനാരായണ ഗുരു നിർബാധം ചരിത്രത്തിന്റെ ചവറ്റുകൂട്ടയിലേക്ക് വലിച്ചെറിഞ്ഞത്.

അരുവിപ്പുറം പ്രതിഷ്ഠയുടെ രാഷ്ട്രീയ പ്രസക്തി ദേശീയ രാഷ്ട്രീയത്തിൽ വളരെക്കഴിഞ്ഞിട്ടും ദാഹിക്കുന്ന ഒന്നായിരുന്നില്ല. കൊളോണിയൽ യുക്തിക്കും ഫ്യൂഡൽ മൂല്യങ്ങൾക്കും അക്ഷരാർത്ഥത്തിൽ എതിരായിരുന്നു ശ്രീനാരായണ ധർമ്മം. ശ്രീനാരായണീയ ചിന്ത ആവിഷ്കരിച്ച ധാർമികതയുടെ മണ്ഡലത്തിലാണ് ആധുനിക മലയാളിയുടെ ചിന്ത രൂപപ്പെട്ടത്. അതാകട്ടെ മാറിവരുന്ന ഭരണകൂടങ്ങളുടെ സ്വാര്ഥതാല്പര്യങ്ങൾക്കു ഒട്ടും ദഹിക്കുന്നതായിരുന്നില്ല. ഏതുകാലത്തും ഭരണകൂടത്തിന്റെ ചൂഷണ ഉപകാരണമെന്ന നിലയിൽ ജാതിവ്യവസ്ഥിതി ഇവിടെ നിലനിന്നുപോരുന്നു. മറിച്ച് ശ്രീനാരായണ ധർമ്മത്തിന്റെ മൗലികത കണ്ടെത്താൻ നമ്മൾ ഇതുവരെ ശ്രമിച്ചിട്ടില്ല.



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
