




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Message from the Managing Trustee




ALISS- Pre-Seminar Workshop- Dept. of English

Pre-Seminar Workshop for Psychology Students



Visit to Mental Health Centre, Thrissur

The visit to the Government Mental Health Centre in Thrissur, organized as part of the curriculum for the Minor Course in Health Psychology under the Department of Nutrition and Dietetics, on 18 February 2025, provided students with a valuable opportunity for hands-on exposure to the operations of a mental health facility, enhancing their understanding of psychological services, mental health treatments, and interdisciplinary collaboration in clinical settings.

Mental Health Centre, Thrissur, who shared valuable information about various career opportunities in psychology, including clinical, counseling, and forensic psychology. Medical Camp and Awareness Class for Women organized by NSS and Women Development Cell in Collaboration with KIMS Al Shifa Hospital


