
#### Maths Faculty Attend Workshop on Preparation of Question Bank

#### Inauguration of Human Rights Week Observance





#### Publication of Article by Ms. Shibla

The article titled "A Bibliometric Analysis of the Structure and Trends of Job Embeddedness (JE) in Business and Management", was published in the Journal Informatics Education and Research (ISSN: 1526-4726), Volume 4, Issue 3 (2024) by Ms. Shibla Sherin, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Commerce and Management.

The study employs bibliometric analysis using the Biblioshiny software to map the intellectual structure of Job Embeddedness (JE) research in the fields of business and management. The authors analysed 271 articles, pertaining to the most influential countries, journals, and authors, as well as the major research streams and future directions in JE literature. The findings highlight three broad themes: cultural differences in JE behaviors, development of JE constructs, and methodological advancements in the study of JE. This comprehensive review fills a significant gap in the literature, offering practical implications for scholars and practitioners.

#### Star of the Month








