### From the Principal's Desk


Dear Students, Faculty, and Well-wishers,

### Awareness Programme on Safe Social Media Usage

The Dept. of Computer Science in collaboration with the Cyber Club, ACAS, as part of the student awareness programmes, organized a session titled "Social Media & You: Awareness Programme on Effective and Safe Social Media Usage" on 01 July 2025. The session was led by Mr. Farhan V. M, Head, Dept. of Computer Science, with the aim of educating students on the responsible and secure use of social media in today's



digitally connected world. He discussed key topics, including the risks of careless usage, the importance of digital footprints, safe communication, cyberbullying, online scams, and privacy protection. The interactive session featured students sharing their experiences and raising questions related to social media challenges. Real-life examples were presented to help students understand existing cyber threats. The program concluded with a message encouraging students to be responsible digital citizens.

In his inaugural speech, Mr. Nahas spoke about the psychological and emotional impact of ragging on victims and shared insights into the preventive measures institutions should adopt. He also appreciated the initiatives of ACAS in creating a student-friendly campus atmosphere. The key session was handled by Dr. Kamaludheen, K. T. Principal, ACAS, Dr. Kamaludheen provided a comprehensive overview of anti-ranging laws, the UGC regulations, and institutional policies. He elaborated on the disciplinary actions for those involved in such acts and explained the role of students in upholding the dignity and decorum of the academic community. He encouraged students to act responsibly and to report any instances of ragging without hesitation. The session was interactive and informative, offering students a platform to clarify their doubts and express their views. The audience comprised second-year students from various departments, who actively participated in the session.

## **English Club hosts Community Roleplay Session**



The English Club of ACAS conducted an engaging and thought-provoking session titled "Fishing for Solutions: A Village Voices Event" on 07 July 2025. The programme was designed to develop students' communication, critical thinking, and creative writing skills through real-world themes and interactive participation. As part of the activity, students were divided into groups, each assuming a specific role relevant to the ongoing debate on the expansion of cage fish farming in Kerala. The roles included an English journalist, cage fish farmer, fish consumer, local fisherman, young entrepreneur, and environmental activist. Each group presented their arguments and opinions in a simulated village meeting conducted in the field, using formal expressions, persuasive language, and topic-specific vocabulary. It highlighted the importance of considering multiple perspectives in community discussions and encouraged students to express themselves with confidence and clarity.

Ms. Febeena K, Assistant Professor, Department of Malayalam, and the resource person for the programme, delivered a thoughtful and engaging session reflecting on the unforgettable characters and human values portrayed in Basheer's literary works. The session provided insights into Basheer's storytelling style, humour, and deep empathy for common people.

### **Exit Ticket Feedback Activity for Commerce students**

The Department of Commerce and Management Studies conducted an Exit Ticket Feedback activity for the subject Income Tax Law and Accounts on 08 July 2025. The feedback focused on topics covered over the past four weeks, including Introduction to Income Tax, Residential Status, and Scope of Income. #### The Review Room: Conversations with Books

The Dept. of English started a series of book review presentations titled 'The Review Room: Conversations with Books' on 08 July 2025. The presenter of the day was Mr. Amal Jaz. P. of Fifth Semester B. A. English Language and Literature. Mr. Amal reviewed the novel 'The Lowland' by Jhumpa Lahiri. He spoke about how Jhumpa Lahiri intricately connects personal loss with political turmoil, illustrating the devastating impact of ideological conflict on familial bonds. He highlighted how the novel's quiet intensity draws readers into the emotional aftermath of revolution, particularly through the contrasting lives of the two brothers, Subhash and Udayan.



The dept. continued its intellectually stimulating series of book review presentations on 10 July 2025. The presenter for the day was Ms. Fathima Afna. T, of Fifth Semester B. A. English Language and Literature. Ms. Afna reviewed the novella The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde by Robert Louis Stevenson, offering keen insights into the duality of human nature depicted in the novel. She explored how Stevenson masterfully portrays the tension between societal expectations and suppressed desires, reflecting the psychological and moral complexity within individuals. Through the tragic unraveling of Dr. Jekyll and the emergence of his dark alter ego Mr. Hyde, Ms. Afna emphasized the timeless relevance of the novel's central theme: the struggle between good and evil residing within the same person.





### **News Round Up 7**



Ms. Fathimath Farhana, E. T. of Fifth Semester B. A. English Language and Literature continued the review on 11 July 2025. Ms. Farhana reviewed the classic novel Robinson Crusoe by Daniel Defoe, offering thoughtful reflections on the themes of survival, self-reliance, and colonialism embedded within the narrative. She examined how Defoe constructs the journey of Crusoe as not merely a tale of adventure, but a profound exploration of individualism, faith, and the imperial mindset of the 18th century. By tracing Crusoe's transformation from shipwrecked castaway to a resourceful and introspective man, Ms. Farhana highlighted the novel's complex engagement with human resilience and adaptability.

The thought-provoking series of book review presentations continued on 14 July 2025. Ms. Amna. T, of Fifth Semester B. A. English Language and Literature reviewed The Tales of Beedle the Bard by J. K. Rowling, a collection of magical fairy tales rooted in the wizarding world. She explored how J. K. Rowling reimagines the essence of folklore, blending enchantment with ethical depth. Focusing on tales such as "The Tale of the Three Brothers", she discussed themes like the acceptance of mortality, the dangers of unchecked power, and the value of compassion and wisdom. Her presentation emphanized the timeless power of storytelling and its ability to convey moral lessons across generations. The session encouraged the undience to reflect on how fantasy literature can offer profound truths about human nature.





'The Review Room: Conversations with Books' continued on 15 July 2025 with Ms. Hiba. P, of Fifth Semester B. A. English Language and Literature reviewing the spiritual classic The Prophet by Kahlil Gibran, a timeless collection of poetic essays exploring the human experience. In her presentation, she highlighted the lyrical beauty and philosophical depth of Gibran's reflections on love, joy, sorrow, work, freedom, and self-knowledge. She emphasized how the book speaks to the soul, offering profound insights into the emotional and spiritual dimensions of everyday life.





Mr. Anthad presented a review of The Lion King by Justine Korman, on 17 July 2025, offering a thoughtful exploration of the story's powerful themes of love, loss, responsibility, and redemption. Drawing on the literary adaptation of the classic animated film, he examined how the narrative captures the emotional journey of Simba as he confronts his past and embraces his destiny. His analysis highlighted the rich symbolism of the "circle of life," the inner conflict between fear and courage, and the story's enduring relevance across generations. The presentation encouraged students to reflect on how children's literature can carry deep moral lessons and universal truths.





Ms. Fathima Rifna. T. P reviewed The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes by Arthur Conan Doyle, on 18 July 2025, taking the audience through the world of deduction, logic, and intrigue. She explored how Sherlock Holmes, as a character, has become a timeless symbol of intellect and analytical reasoning. Through selected stories, she examined the narrative techniques, plot twists, and the socio-cultural backdrop of Victorian London. Her presentation offered students an appreciation for classic detective fiction and its enduring appeal.





Ms. Fidha Febin reviewed the celebrated novella The Old Man and the Sea by Ernest Hemingway on 21 July 2025 as a continuation of the series 'The Review Room: Convertation with Books'. In her presentation, she explored the narrative of Santiago, an aging fisherman whose solitary struggle against nature becomes a powerful metaphor for endurance, dignity, and quiet resilience. She highlighted how Hemingway's minimalist style and rich symbolism—through the sea, the marlin, and the sharks—convey deep philosophical insights into human life and effort.

### Research Forum by the Department of English

The Department of English organized a Research Forum on 08 July 2025 as part of its academic enrichment activities. Ms. Renjitha. K. R., Assistant Professor and Head of the Dept. of English, presented a review of the article "Compassion, Hunger and Animal Suffering: Scenes from Kerala, South India" by Susan Haris, affiliated with the University of California, Santa Cruz and HT Delhi. The article explores how compassion toward animals intersects with human hunger and poverty



in Kerala. The session prompted meaningful discussion on ethical and socio-cultural issues related to animal-human relationships, offering valuable insights into lived experiences shaped by economic and emotional complexities.



As part of the ongoing Research Forum series held on 11 July 2025, Ms. Radhika. A, Aust. Professor of English, ACAS presented an academic review of the paper titled "Digital Narratives: Exploring Literature in the Age of Technology" by Manpreet Kaur, published in the American Research Journal of Humanities and Social Sciences (Vol. 10, Issue 1, 2024). The presentation explored how literature has evolved through technological advancements; embracing multimedia elements and interactive

formats. Ms. Radhika highlighted tools like Twine, social media, and podeasts that allow for personalized and non-linear storytelling, making literature more accessible and inclusive. She also addressed challenges such as preserving digital content and bridging the digital divide. The session concluded with an engaging discussion, offering valuable ineights into the future of storytelling in the digital age.

### Speak to Shine: Peer Teaching Session
