Disaster Management Training





The Disaster Management Course, organized by ACAS in collaboration with the Kerala Police Department, was held from 09 to12 September 2025. The programme was inaugurated by Mr. K. T. Abdul Rassaque, Secretary, Shifa Medicare Trust, in the presence of Dr. Kamaludheen. K. T, Principal and Mr. Irshad. K, NSS Programme Officer. The course was led by Mr. Bijumon P. Joseph, Police Inspector, Kerala Armed Police Battalion and his expert team of police personnel. Over four days, students and NSS volunteers received both theoretical and practical training in disaster preparedness and emergency response. Key topics included Introduction to Disaster Management, EMS & BLS, Cardiovascular System, CPR, FBAO, Soft Tissue Patient Assessment, Disaster Relief Camp Planning, Injuries, Musculoskeletal Injuries, Burns, Snake Bites, and Oxygen Therapy. Practical sessions gave students hands-on experience in CPR, casualty evacuation, bandaging, vital signs monitoring, water rescue techniques, and fire safety drills. The Advanced Disaster Response Course (ADRC) module provided specialized training in swimming, flood rescue operations, and firefighting. The course concluded on 12 September 2025 with a Closing Ceremony, featuring felicitation of the police faculty team, certificate distribution, and addresses by dignitaries including Mr. P. Hamza, Chief Executive, Shifa Medicare Trust. The programme proved highly impactful, equipping students with life-saving skills and highlighting the importance of academic-law enforcement collaboration in building a prepared and resilient community.

Project Orientation Session



The tour provided a blend of recreation and learning, helping students understand the economic significance of tourism, local livelihoods, and sustainable development practices in hill regions. The study tour proved to be both educational and memorable, fostering teamwork, curiosity, and a deeper appreciation for the intersection of economics, environment, and culture.

Visit to MPI Meat Products of India Limited

The First and Third Semester students of B. Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics visited MPI Meat Products of India Limited, a Government of Kerala Undertaking on 16 September 2025. The visit was organized as part of the academic programme to provide practical exposure to meat production procedures and the scientific aspects of meat processing. During the visit, the students were introduced to the production procedures of different types of animal meat. The introduction session included important topics such as the process of meat aging and its impact on meat quality, as well as the importance of scientific and hygienic slaughtering methods in ensuring safe and high-quality meat production. Following the theoretical session, the students were taken for a guided plant visit where they observed the separate slaughtering sections for various animals, including buffalo or cow, pig, goat, and birds (poultry). One of the most insightful parts of the visit was the opportunity to observe the live slaughtering of a pig, conducted under strict scientific and hygienic standards. This practical exposure gave the students a real-life understanding of meat processing and the importance of maintaining safety and hygiene at each step. The experience proved to be highly valuable in helping students bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application in the field of Nutrition and Dietetics.







Identifying Suicide Risk and Resilience Through Coping Strategies

The Postgraduate Dept. of Psychology, organized a quest talk ACAS, "Identifying Suicide Risk and Resilience Through Coping Strategies" September 2025. The session, led by Mr. Murshid Puthoor, Consultant Psychologist (Relicus), was part of the department's initiative "Changing the Narrative on talk Suicide." The aimed to raise awareness about recognizing early signs of suicide risk, understanding protective factors, and fostering resilience through effective coping mechanisms. Murshid highlighted key psychological factors, stress management and the significance of techniques, adaptive coping in promoting mental interactive well-being. The session meaningful engaged students in discussions on real-life situations and preventive interventions.





Student Research Forum

The Postgraduate Department of Psychology, ACAS, conducted a Student Research Forum on 17 September 2025, led by Ms. Shahana, First Semester M.Sc. Clinical Psychology student. emphasizing how cognitive principles can aid in understanding and enhancing AI models like GPT-3. The presentation highlighted the potential applications of digital tools in psychological research and practice. The forum concluded with an engaging discussion on integrating such technologies to improve research methodologies and clinical approaches.

Dept. of Computer Science

Ms. Shahma's interactive approach and confident handling of queries made the session engaging and informative, effectively reinforcing the importance of peer teaching in promoting collaborative learning.

There was a time in her life when darkness felt more familiar than light. She was a wife, a daughter-in-law, and eventually... just a mother trying to hold on.

The toxicity she endured in her married life was not something she had ever imagined would become her reality. The whole life became upside down, but she adjusted. She compromised. She remained silent for six long years, hoping that things would change—for her family, for her kids, and for the marriage she once believed in. But the more tried to adjust, she realized that the life she dreamt about once in her life was entirely different. She realized that the adjustment and compromise which was supposed to be from both sides, was just a one way path. The more she tried to fit into a mold someone else created for her, the more she began to lose herself. She began to lose her physical and mental health.

Eventually, she decided to walk away—not because it was easy, but because staying would have destroyed her.

Raising two kids alone was never part of her dream. There were days when the financial strain kept her awake all night. Her parents never asked about anything but just became her backbone. It was the time when she realized the colors of true friends who supported her like anything. She went for counseling —not because she was weak, but because she needed to find strength again. The toughest time was when her daughter longed for a home with both parents, not knowing the truth behind the broken pieces she was trying to hold together.

The quote which says, 'only our pillows know the amount of pain we hide from the world' was literally true for her. Everyone around her blamed her. "You should've adjusted more," they said. But they didn't see the parts of her she had already sacrificed. They didn't hear the harsh words she swallowed or witness the loneliness she endured while surrounded by people.

Yet, in the middle of all the chaos, her biggest healers were her children. Their tight hugs, their innocent smiles, and the way they looked at her with unconditional love—those were her medicines. She wasn't perfect. Some days she was broken, some days she was angry, she was frustrated, and many days she was too sensitive. But she showed up, every single day, for them.

She did everything she could to give them a better life—even if she was still healing. She didn't want sympathy. Not for her, and certainly not for her kids. She always believed that her kids will not be in better condition if they were with both their parents. The only thing she wanted and still wants is dignity. Being a single mother isn't a role she chose, but it's a role she has embraced with all her heart. And while the journey is far from easy, it is filled with purpose. Her children are not just her responsibility—they are her strength, her reason for living, and her future.

To every woman walking a similar path: you are more than the judgments thrown at you. You are not broken—you are rebuilding. And one day, your children will look at you and say, "Thank you for never giving up."

And truly, that will be everything..

To the Woman Who Shaped Me

"Not every daughter-in-laws are perfect, but a perfect mother-in-law makes her one".

In today's world, the word mother-in-law still often carries fear and judgment. Society has long wrapped this figure in layers of misunderstanding and stereotypes. Stories of dowry demands, controlling behavior, and endless conflicts between mothers-in-law and daughters-in-law still make headlines. Many women enter marriage carrying not just dreams, but also fear — fear of rejection, fear of comparison, fear of never being enough. I too carried such fears. Growing up as a fatherless child, I was strong on the outside but fragile within. My stubbornness was not pride, but armor. Even when I stepped into a marriage of choice, I carried that shield with me, perhaps too tightly. I believed I could never survive without my Amma, but life gently proved me wrong. With tears hidden in my pillow and courage stitched into my smile, I left behind her comforting arms and walked into a new home. The shift was terrifying — from the familiar embrace of Guruvayur to the unfamiliar Perinthalmanna. The food, the language, the mannerisms, the expectations everything felt like another world. And in that world, I felt like a lost child disquised as a new bride.

And then she entered. Not with the iron hand of authority that society often whispers about, but with the gentle touch of grace. My mother-in-law did not see me as a rival or an outsider; she saw me as a daughter. In a time when many women are still crushed under the weight of dowry, she lifted the weight off my shoulders with her acceptance. In a culture where daughters-in-law are often measured by how well they cook or how obediently they bend, she measured me only by the depth of my heart. She gave me space when I needed it, guidance when I sought it, and love when I least expected it. And then came the most delicate, vulnerable time of a woman's life — pregnancy and delivery. I imagined Amma by my side, holding my hand through fear, calming me through pain. But fate was cruel. Covid came, and Amma could not be with me. The thought of giving birth without her broke me in ways I cannot describe. I felt like a child abandoned in the middle of a storm. But then, something unexpected happened. My mother-in-law stepped into that emptiness. When labor pains gripped me, it was her hand I held.

When tears rolled down silently, it was her voice that whispered strength into me. When fear made me tremble, it was her presence that steadied me. In every moment where I thought I would collapse, she stood tall beside me — not as a distant mother-in-law, but as though Amma herself had extended her love through her.

That was the moment I realized: love does not end with one person. Love finds a way to reach you again, sometimes through another heart. In a world where many daughters-in-law are silenced by dowry demands or harsh comparisons, she chose acceptance. She never tried to break me. Instead, she gathered my broken pieces and held them together with love. Slowly, her small acts of care melted my arrogance. She did not make me feel like an outsider; she made me feel like a daughter who belonged. If Amma was the root that gave me strength, she was the shade that sheltered me. If Amma was the river that carried me through childhood, she was the ocean that received me in womanhood.

Dear Mother, you became the Amma I thought I had lost during the hardest moment of my life. You are the reason my pregnancy was not loneliness, but love. You are the reason my arrogance softened into trust. You are the reason I believe again that love is endless, limitless, and unconditional. I came to you as a daughter-in-law, but you held me as a daughter — and that is the greatest gift life has ever given me.


