

Her talk focused on how aspirants can overcome mental barriers and sustain consistent preparation through scientifically proven psychological strategies. #### Session on the Fundamentals of Microsoft Word

A session on the Fundamentals of Microsoft Word was conducted for B. Com. CA students of the 2025–'29 batch on 08 October 2025. Organized by the Dept. of Commerce and Management Studies, the session introduced students to the basic features and interface of MS Word. Key areas covered included creating and



saving documents, text formatting with different fonts, sizes, styles, and colors, as well as paragraph alignment, line spacing, and indentation. The session aimed to build a strong foundation in MS Word, enabling students to create well-structured academic and professional documents efficiently. During the session, special emphasis was given to the use of shortcut keys to enhance productivity and ease of working within MS Word. Students were encouraged to practice hands-on tasks such as using spell check, copy-paste functions, and undo-redo operations. The interactive approach allowed students to clarify doubts and gain practical experience, thereby improving their confidence and competence in handling basic word processing tasks for their coursework and future professional requirements.



The second session on the same was held on 10 October 2025, primarily focused on paragraph restructuring and editing techniques in MS Word. Students guided on how to paragraph layouts, apply alignment margins, options, adjust and indentation effectively to enhance document presentation. The session

also covered practical tools such as Find and Replace, Cut, Copy, and Paste, and the use of Undo and Redo functions for efficient document editing. Emphasis was placed on maintaining consistency and professional formatting in academic and project-related documents. The interactive and hands-on approach enabled students to gain better clarity and confidence in handling document editing tasks, thereby improving their overall word processing skills.

## Seed Pen Making Workshop



A Seed Pen Making Workshop was conducted on 08 October 2025 at Poonthanam Smaraka AUP School, Kizhattur, organized by the Consumers Club in collaboration with the Dept. of Commerce and Management Studies. The workshop aimed to promote eco-friendly habits among students and create awareness about reducing plastic waste by encouraging the use of

paper seed pens instead of plastic ones. The students from the JRC and Scout units of the Upper Primary Section actively participated in the session. Resource persons from the department demonstrated the process of making seed pens using waste paper, ink refills, and seeds such as coriander and tulsi. The programme featured two distinguished resource persons from Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi – Dr. Quazi Ferdoushi Islam and Dr. Sameer Babu. M, Associate Professors, Dept. of Educational Studies. The event saw the presence of Dr. Kamaludheen K. T, Principal, ACAS and Mr. P. Hamza, Chief Executive, Shifa Medicare Trust. Dr. Quazi Ferdoushi Islam led the first session on "Effective Teaching: Principles, Learning Styles, and Strategies for Engaging Learners." She discussed the importance of adapting teaching techniques to different learning styles and shared practical insights for enhancing classroom participation. Dr. Sameer Babu. M, led the next session on "Integrating Technology in Teaching: The Flipped Classroom Approach." He emphasized the use of digital tools, online resources, and interactive platforms to create dynamic and student-centered learning experiences. The sessions were highly engaging and informative, encouraging faculty members to adopt innovative, technology-supported, and learner-centered approaches in their teaching practices. The FDP proved to be an inspiring and intellectually enriching experience, fostering a spirit of collaboration and continuous professional growth among the faculty.



# Peer Teaching Session-Dept. of Commerce & Management Studies

A Peer Teaching session organized by Commerce the Dept. of and Management Studies was held on 07 October 2025. The core focus of the teaching session was the foundational accounting topic, Introduction to Final Accounts. The session was led by Ms. First Niya Marva, Semester programme. This initiative highlights the college's focus on fostering student engagement and developing academic skills through peer-to-peer instruction.







As part of the ongoing series of Peer teaching sessions, the department organised another session on 13 October 2025, led by Ms. Fazna. S, First Semester BBA. The theme of the session was "Planning Premises in Management", a crucial concept in the field of managerial planning and decision-making. Ms. Fazna explained the meaning and significance of planning premises, emphasizing their role as the foundation on which plans are formulated. She discussed various types of planning premises such as internal and external premises, tangible and intangible premises, controllable and uncontrollable premises, and illustrated how these factors influence effective planning in organizations. Real-life business examples and case-based discussions were included to enhance understanding and connect theoretical ideas to practical scenarios. The peer teaching session provided an excellent opportunity for collaborative learning, allowing students to gain deeper insights into the topic. The session was well-structured, informative, and successfully met its objectives, contributing effectively to the teaching-learning process.

Another session of the series was organised by the department on 13 October 2025, led by Ms. Anhal. V, First Semester BBA. The theme of the session was "Types of Planning", an important concept in the field of management. Ms. Anhal delivered the topic effectively, demonstrating clear understanding and enthusiasm, which made the session both engaging and informative. During the session, she explained the different types of planning such as corporate, divisional, strategic, tactical, operational, long-term, medium-term, and short-term planning. Each type was discussed in detail, highlighting its purpose, scope, and significance in achieving organizational goals. Real-life business examples and practical illustrations were used to enhance understanding and relate the topic to real-world management practices. The session was well-organized, insightful, and successful in promoting peer-led learning and enhancing the academic experience of the students.





A peer teaching session was organized on the topic "Contract of Agency," a vital concept in Business and Mercantile Law, on 14 October 2025. The session was led by Mr. Salmanul Faris, Third Semester B. Com. Finance, who provided an insightful presentation on the definition, creation, and essentials of an agency relationship. He elaborated on the rights, duties, and liabilities of agents and principals, and explained the types and termination of agency with relevant business examples. The session was interactive and wellreceived. successfully creating engaging environment that encouraged discussion and deeper understanding of legal principles in commerce.



Another peer-to-peer teaching session on the topic "Contract of Guarantee" was conducted on 14 October 2025, presented by Mr. Muhammed Sinan. K, Third Semester B. Com. Computer Applications. He discussed the definition, essentials, and legal implications of a contract of quarantee, illustrating his points with practical examples. The interactive approach promoted



active participation and created a comfortable learning environment where students exchanged ideas and clarified doubts. The session effectively strengthened students' grasp of business law concepts through peer collaboration.



A peer teaching session was also conducted by Ms. Najma, Third Semester BBA, for the First Semester BBA students on the topic "Profit and Loss Account." The objective of the session was to help first-year students understand the preparation, structure, and purpose of the Profit and Loss Account in accounting. Ms. Najma explained its meaning, objectives, and format, highlighting key items on the debit and credit sides with the help of examples and simple numerical problems. Her clear explanation and interactive approach made the topic engaging and easy to comprehend. The session received positive feedback for its clarity and effectiveness in reinforcing fundamental accounting concepts.

Similarly, Mr. Hashmil, Third Semester BBA, conducted a session for First Semester BBA students on "Introduction to Balance Sheet." The session aimed to introduce the basic structure, objectives, and significance of the balance sheet in accounting. Mr. Hashmil explained the classification of assets and liabilities and illustrated how a balance sheet reflects the financial position of a business at a given time. The use of real-life examples and simple illustrations made the session highly interactive Students and comprehensible. participated, making the learning experience productive and engaging.



In addition, the Department organized another session on 14 October 2025, led by Ms. Fitha. V. P. and Ms. Hadiya, both First Semester BBA students. The topic of discussion was "Challenges Limitations of Planning." The presenters effectively explained key challenges in the planning process-such as lack accurate information, rigidity, time constraints, resistance to change, and uncertainty—using relatable examples and real-life scenarios. The interactive discussion encouraged student participation and critical thinking. The session also served as an platform for the presenters to enhance their communication and teaching skills.





Continuing the series, another peer teaching session was conducted on 24 October 2025 by Ms. Nimisha K of Third Semester B. Com Taxation on the topic "Discharge of Contract by Time." She elaborated on the different modes of discharge such as performance, mutual agreement, impossibility, lapse of time, operation of law, and breach of contract, providing clear explanations supported by examples and case references. The interactive approach encouraged student engagement and collaborative learning, making the session insightful and effective in strengthening conceptual understanding and communication skills.





As part of the Peer Teaching Sessions organized by the Dept. of Commerce and Management Studies, a session was conducted on 24 October 2025 for the Third Semester B. Com Taxation students by Ms. Finu Sherin on the topic "Discharge of Contract." She explained the various modes of discharge, including performance, mutual agreement, impossibility of performance, lapse of time, operation of law, and breach of contract, using relevant examples and case references. The interactive session encouraged active participation and discussion, making the learning process engaging and effective. It proved to be a valuable experience that enhanced both the presenter's teaching skills and the participants' understanding of the topic.

## **Mentor-Mentee Programme**

The Mentor–Mentee Interaction, an initiative aimed at fostering personal, academic, and professional growth among students through continuous guidance and support, was conducted on 13 October 2025, as part of the institution's ongoing mentoring programme. The session aimed to strengthen the bond between mentors and mentees, provide academic and personal guidance, and discuss students' progress and well-being. During the interaction, mentors engaged with their respective mentees to review academic performance, attendance, and overall participation in college activities. Students were encouraged to share their concerns and suggestions related to academics and personal development. Mentors provided necessary guidance, motivation, and support to help students overcome challenges and plan for future goals.





## Workshop on LED Bulb Manufacturing

The Entrepreneurship Development Club, ACAS, organized an educational workshop on the practical skills of LED bulb manufacturing on 15 October 2025. The session was led by Mr. Sabir. P, LED Master Trainer, Elight Industries, Malappuram. Under his expert guidance, participants gained valuable insights into the technical and practical aspects of LED bulb production. The workshop emphasized



hands-on learning, allowing students to actively participate in the process of assembling and understanding LED bulbs. This experiential approach greatly enhanced their technical competence and entrepreneurial awareness. The students took part in the workshop and left with enhanced knowledge and practical skills in the field of LED bulb manufacturing.

# Peer Teaching- Dept. of Computer Science

A Peer Teaching Programme was conducted for the First Semester Artificial Intelligence B. Sc. students on 15 October 2025. The teaching session peer was effectively handled by Mr. Jasin First Semester B. Artificial Intelligence, on the topic "Active Components in Computer Hardware." During the session, the presenter explained concept of active components, highlighting their functions and importance in electronic circuits



and computer hardware systems. Components such as transistors, integrated circuits (ICs), and diodes were discussed with practical examples. The session aimed to enhance students' understanding of hardware fundamentals through peer-led learning.



Continuing the series, another Peer Teaching Session was held on the same day, 23 October 2025 on the topic "BIOS Chip in Motherboard." It was conducted by Mr. Muhammed Shifil. M, First Semester B. Sc. Al. The session aimed to strengthen students' understanding of computer hardware through collaborative learning. The presenter clearly explained the structure function of the BIOS chip, its role

in the booting process, and how it enables communication between hardware and the operating system. Active student participation and discussions made the session engaging and productive, helping learners gain deeper insight into the functioning of computer systems.



Continuing the initiative, the Dept. of Computer Science organized another Peer-to-Peer Teaching Session for the Fifth Semester BCA students on 17 October 2025. The session was conducted by Ms. Nidra. P, Fifth Semester BCA, on the topic "I/O Streams in Java." As part of the department's ongoing peer-learning programme, the session aimed to promote collaborative learning and strengthen students' conceptual clarity. Ms. Nidra explained the concept of Input and Output Streams

in Java, elaborating on various stream classes, types of streams (Byte Stream and Character Stream), and their practical applications in file handling. Through clear examples and interactive discussions, students gained a better understanding of data reading and writing processes in Java, making the session both engaging and informative.

As part of the ongoing Peer Teaching Sessions organized by the Dept. of Computer Science, a session on the topic "Standard Distributions" was conducted on 23 October 2025 for the minor paper in Statistics under the B. Sc. Artificial Intelligence programme. The session was handled



by Ms. Hidha Sherin, Third Semester B. Sc. Al, who explained key statistical distributions such as Binomial, Poisson, and Normal, along with their properties, formulas, and real-life applications. Through examples and graphical illustrations, she made complex concepts easier to grasp. The session was interactive, with students actively engaging in discussions, making it both informative and effective in enhancing conceptual understanding and communication skills.

# Ready, Set, Excel!: Remedial Coaching Series

The Dept. of English, ACAS, conducted a remedial coaching series titled "Ready, Set, Excel!" for Third Semester B. A. English Language & Literature students. The session took place on 15 October 2025. വാർത്തകളിലും സാഹിത്യത്തിലും നിറയുന്ന ജീവിതങ്ങൾ അഭയാർത്ഥി ചോദ്യ ചിഹ്നമായി നമുക്ക് മുന്നിൽ നിൽക്കുന്നു. എപ്പോഴും ഒരു ബന്ധങ്ങളിലൂടെ, വേരുമില്ലാത്ത മനുഷ്യർ സങ്കീർണ്ണമായ കുറെ സാഹചര്യങ്ങളിലൂടെ ജീവിച്ചു തീർക്കുന്ന അനുഭവങ്ങൾക്ക് ഒരുപാട് പാഠങ്ങൾ ചരിത്രം പഠിപ്പിക്കാനുണ്ട്. യുദ്ധങ്ങളുടെയും ലോക പ്രവാഹങ്ങളുടെയും കൂടെ ചരിത്രമാണ്. അതിപുരാതന കാലത്ത് സാപ്പിയൻസും നിയാണ്ടർത്താലുകളും തമ്മിൽ നടന്ന യുദ്ധങ്ങൾ മുതൽ ഇന്ന് ഇസ്രായേലും പാലസ്തീനും തമ്മിൽ നടക്കുന്ന യുദ്ധം വരെ പറയുന്ന ജീവിതങ്ങളും കൂടക്കുരുതികളും നഷ്ട രക്തപ്പുഴകളും ബാക്കിയാകുന്നു. ബാക്കിയാകുന്ന മനുഷ്യർ ചെയ്യുന്നു എന്ത് എന്ന് യുദ്ധശേഷം ആലോചിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ടോ? ഭാണ്ടവുമായി നിലനിൽപ്പിനായുള്ള കെട്ടും പ്രയാണത്തിനൊടുവിൽ എത്തിച്ചേരുന്ന അഭയാർത്ഥി ക്യാമ്പുകൾ കൂടുതലും ദുരിതപൂർണ്ണമാണ്. നഷ്ടബോധത്തിൽ അമരുമ്പോൾ ചുറ്റും ബാക്കിയാവുന്നത് വൃത്തിഹീനമായ പരിസരങ്ങളും ഇടുങ്ങിയ ടെന്റുകളുമാണ്. പിറന്ന നാടിനോടുള്ള സ്നേഹത്തിൽ അഭിമാനിക്കുന്നവരാണ് എല്ലാ മനുഷ്യരും. ആ നാടുതന്നെ പിടിച്ചുപറിക്കപ്പെട്ട മനുഷ്യർ വിലാസമില്ലാത്ത രേഖകളില്ലാത്ത ദേശമില്ലാത്ത അഭയതീരം തേടി അലയാൻ വിധിക്കപ്പെടുന്നു. 'നിഴലുകളായി' നീതിന്യായങ്ങളെയെല്ലാം നോക്കുകുത്തിയാക്കുന്ന മനുഷ്യരുടെ, കഥകൾ വായിക്കാൻ നല്ല മനക്കരുത്ത് വേണം.

അങ്ങനെയുള്ള ഒരു കഥയാണ് തപോമയിയുടെ അച്ഛൻ. ഇരുപതാം നൂറ്റാണ്ടിലെ ബംഗ്ലാദേശ് ആഭ്യന്തര കലാപങ്ങളിൽ നിന്നും ഓടിരക്ഷപ്പെട്ട് പല ഘട്ടങ്ങളിലായി ഇന്ത്യയിൽ എത്തിയ കുറെ മനുഷ്യരുടെ ശേഷജീവിതമാണ് ഈ വർഷത്തെ വയലാർ അവാർഡ് നേടിയ ഇ. സന്തോഷ്കുമാറിന്റെ നോവലിന്റെ ഇതിവൃത്തം. അഭയാർത്ഥി ഇന്ത്യൻ ഉപഭൂഖണ്ടം കുറെയേറെ പ്രവാഹങ്ങളെ തമിഴർ, മ്യാന്മാറിൽ വാങ്ങിയിട്ടുണ്ട്; ശ്രീലങ്കൻ നിന്നുള്ള രോഹിങ്ക്യർ, അഫ്ഘാനികൾ, ടിബറ്റൻ ബുദ്ധിസ്റ്റുകൾ, പാകിസ്ഥാനികൾ എന്നിവർക്ക് പുറമെ നിന്നുള്ള രാജ്യങ്ങളിൽ അഭയാർത്ഥികളും പല അഫ്രിക്കൻ കഴിഞ്ഞുകൂടുന്നു. നോവലിൽ കാണുന്ന ക്യാമ്പ് ഒട്ടേറെ പ്രതികൂല ഘടകങ്ങളെ തരണം ചെയ്തു കൊണ്ട് ജീവിതം കരുപിടിപ്പിക്കാൻ ഓടി നടക്കുന്ന മനുഷ്യരുടെ പുറമ്പോക്കാണ്. പക പോക്കാൻ വെച്ച തീയും പേമാരിയിലെ വെള്ളപ്പൊക്കവും ദാരിദ്ര്യവും ഒക്കെ കടന്ന് മരണം വരെയും ജീവിക്കാൻ വിധിക്കപ്പെട്ടവരാണ് അവിടെയുള്ളത്. കൊടും ക്രൂരതകളും കൊലയും ബലാൽസംഘവും ശാരീരിക പീഡനവും ഒക്കെ അനുഭവമാക്കിയവർ.

കയ്യൊഴിഞ്ഞതിന്റെ പ്രകൃതിയും അവിടത്തെ മനുഷ്യരും ഒരു ദേശവും ബാക്കിപത്രമായി ഡൽഹിയിൽ കഴിയുന്ന ആളുകളുടെ സഹായി ആയിട്ടാണ് തപോമായി എത്തുന്നത്. വിചിത്രമായ കോഡുഭാഷയിൽ ഡയറി എഴുതുന്ന തപോമയിയുടെ അച്ഛൻ കഥാകാരന്റെ സുഹൃത്താവുന്നു. അവരുടെ ഗത കാല ജീവിതം സംഭാഷണങ്ങളിലൂടെയും ഡയറി കുറിപ്പുകളിലൂടെയും പുറത്തു വരുന്ന ആഖ്യാന രീതിയാണ് അവലംഭിച്ചിട്ടുള്ളത്. വിവരണങ്ങളിൽ നിറയുന്ന ഉൾനാടൻ കൊൽക്കത്തയുടെ ബംഗ്ലാ ഗ്രാമീണതയും പൂർവകാല കമ്യൂണിസത്തിന്റെ തുടക്കവും ഡൽഹിയുടെ ഉൾത്തുടിപ്പുകളും വായനക്കാരെ സഞ്ചാരികളാക്കുന്നു. അധിക ആലങ്കാരികതകൾ സന്തോഷ് കുമാറിന്റെ രചനയുടെ ബലം കഥയുടെ കെട്ടുറപ്പാണ്. എപ്പിസോഡിക് ആയി കഥയുടെ വിശദാമ്ശങ്ങൾ നമ്മിലേക്കെത്തുന്നു. അവസാന പേജുകളിൽ സത്യങ്ങൾ വെളിപ്പെടുന്നത്. അതുവരെയും അണ് വൻ വായനക്കാരെ പിടിച്ചിരുത്താൻ എഴുത്തുകാരന് കഴിഞ്ഞിട്ടുണ്ട്. കഥയുടെ അവസാനത്തിൽ ശരിയും തെറ്റും സ്നേഹവും വെറുപ്പും ബന്ധങ്ങളും ബന്ധനങ്ങളും മനസ്സിൽ ഒരു നോവായി അവശേഷിക്കും. ദാരിദ്ര്യവും രാഷ്ട്രീയ പ്രശ്നങ്ങളും സാമുദായിക ലഹളകളും പിന്നണിയിൽ അരങ്ങേറുമ്പോൾ മനുഷ്യർക്ക് ഒരിക്കലും സ്വസ്ഥമായ ജീവിതം സാധ്യമല്ല എന്ന് ഈ കഥ വീണ്ടും ഓർമ്മിപ്പിക്കുന്നു.

എന്താണ് സ്നേഹം? ആഫ്രിക്കൻ അമേരിക്കൻ എഴുത്തുകാരിയായ ടോണി മോറിസൺ അവരുടെ The Bluest Eye എന്ന നോവലിൽ എഴുതുന്നു- "Love is never any better than the lover. Wicked people love wickedly, violent people love violently, weak people love weakly, stupid people love stupidly, but the love of a free man is never safe. There is no gift for the beloved. The lover alone possesses his gift of love. The loved one is shorn, neutralized, frozen in the glare of the lover's inward eye." സ്വതന്ത്ര മലയാള പരിഭാഷ- 'സ്നേഹം സ്നേഹിക്കുന്ന ആളിൽ നിന്നും ഒട്ടും വ്യത്യസ്തമല്ല. കുബുദ്ധിയായ ഒരാൾ ക്രൂരമായി സ്നേഹിക്കുന്നു, അക്രമിയായ ഒരാൾ ആക്രമണത്തിന്റെ രീതിയിൽ സ്നേഹിക്കുന്നു, ദുർബലനായ ഒരാൾ ഉറപ്പില്ലാത്ത രീതിയിൽ സ്നേഹിക്കുന്നു, വിഡ്ഢിയായ ഒരാൾ അവിവേകത്തിന്റെ രീതിയിൽ സ്നേഹിക്കുന്നു, ഒരാളുടെ സ്നേഹം ഒരിക്കലും സുരക്ഷിതമല്ല. സ്വാതന്ത്രനായ അതിൽ സ്നേഹിക്കപ്പെടുന്ന ആൾക്ക് സമ്മാനമേതുമില്ല. അത് സ്നേഹിക്കുന്നവന്റെ സ്വന്തമാണ്. സ്നേഹിക്കപ്പെടുന്ന ആൾ മാത്രം അവിടെ കമിതാവിന്റെ ഉൾക്കണ്ണിന്റെ വെളിച്ചത്തിനു മുന്നിൽ ഒന്നുമില്ലാതെ നിഷ്പ്രഭമാക്കപ്പെട്ട് മരവിച്ച് പോകുന്നു.' തപോമയിയുടെയും അച്ഛന്റെയും കഥ വായിച്ചപ്പോൾ ഇതാണ് ഓർമയിലേക്ക് എത്തിയത്. ദാരിദ്ര്യത്തിന്റെയും കലാപത്തിന്റെയും മനുഷ്യർ സ്നേഹിക്കുമ്പോൾ മറ്റെങ്ങനെ ബാക്കിപത്രമായ അത് ആയിത്തീരാനാണ്!

വായിച്ചുവെക്കുമ്പോൾ മനസ്സിലേക്ക് തപോമയി ഓടി എത്തുന്ന മറ്റൊന്നുകൂടിയുണ്ട്. നമ്മുടെ കണ്മുന്നിൽ അരങ്ങേറിയ ഗസക്കു മേലെയുള്ള ഇസ്രായേൽ ആക്രമണം. നോവലിൽ നിന്ന് വ്യത്യസ്തമായ രാഷ്ട്രീയ സാഹചര്യം ആണെങ്കിലും ഒന്നുതന്നെയല്ലേ എല്ലായിടങ്ങളിലും മനുഷ്യാവസ്ഥ ഓർത്തുപോകുന്നു. രണ്ടു വർഷം നീണ്ടുനിന്ന വംശഹത്യ നമുക്കുമുന്നിൽ നിർബാധം തുടർന്നു. നടന്നത് 70,000 ത്തിൽ പരം കൊലകൾ (വിക്കിപീഡിയ), ജീവനുകളും, കുറേ മാധ്യമ പ്രവർത്തകരും, അതിൽ കുഞ്ഞു പ്രേരിതമായ പ്രവർത്തകരും. ജനകീയ സമരങ്ങളാൽ ഭരണകൂടങ്ങളുടെ വെടി നിർത്തൽ പ്രഖ്യാപിച്ച സമ്മർദദം കൊണ്ടുമാത്രം ഇസ്രായേൽ മനുഷ്യത്വമില്ലായ്മയുടെ പുതിയ മുഖങ്ങൾ കാണിച്ചുതന്ന യുദ്ധമാണ് കഴിഞ്ഞു പോകുന്നത്. യുദ്ധത്തിൽ കൊല്ലപ്പെട്ട മാധ്യമ പ്രവർത്തകനാണ് അനസ് അൽ ഷരീഫ്.

അൽ ജസീറ രാജ്യാന്തര വാർത്താ ചാനലിൽ പ്രവർത്തിച്ച 28കാരനായ അറബിക് കറസ്പോണ്ടന്റ് അനസ് അൽ ഷരീഫ് ഗാസ സിറ്റിയിൽ 2025 ആഗസ്റ്റ് 10-ന് ഇസ്രായേൽ നടത്തിയ വ്യോമാക്രമണത്തിലാണ് കൊല്ലപ്പെട്ടത്. ആ ഭീകര യുദ്ധം റിപ്പോർട്ട് ചെയ്യുന്നതിനിടെ അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ നാല് സഹപ്രവർത്തകരും ആ ആക്രമണത്തിൽ ഇരകളായി. ഇസ്രായേൽ സേന അനസ് അൽ ഷരീഫ് ഹമാസ് ഭീകരസംഘടനയുമായി ബന്ധപ്പെട്ടു റോക്കറ്റ് ആക്രമണങ്ങൾ നടത്തിയഭീകരനാണെന്ന് ആരോപിച്ചു. എന്നാൽ, അൽ ജസീറ അത് തള്ളി. അനസ് അൽ ഷരീഫ് ഗസ യുദ്ധത്തിന്റെ ഫ്രണ്ട് ലൈൻ റിപ്പോർട്ടിങ് നടത്തിയ ധൈര്യമുള്ള മാധ്യമപ്രവർത്തകനായിരുന്നുവെന്ന് വ്യക്തമാക്കുകയും ചെയ്തു.

അനസ് അൽ ഷരീഫ് തന്റെ മരണാനന്തര സന്ദേശത്തിൽ, "വേദനയും ദുഖവും നഷ്ടവും ആവർത്തിച്ച് സഹിച്ചിട്ടും സത്യം അറിയിക്കാൻ ഒരിക്കലും മടിച്ചിട്ടില്ല" എന്നു പറഞ്ഞിരുന്നു. അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ ചില വീഡിയോകളും റിപ്പോർട്ടിങ്ങും എല്ലാം മരണ ശേഷം കണ്ടിരുന്നു. തന്റെ മക്കളോടൊപ്പം കളിക്കുന്ന ചില വിഷ്വൽസ് വേദന ഉണ്ടാക്കുന്നവയായിരുന്നു. യുദ്ധമുഖങ്ങളിലും വളരെ ഇത്തരത്തിൽ പ്രവാഹങ്ങളിലുമെല്ലാം അഭയാർത്ഥി അകപ്പെട്ടു നമ്മളിൽനിന്നും വ്യത്യസ്തരല്ല. നോർമൽ ജീവിക്കാൻ ആയി ആഗ്രഹിക്കുന്ന സാധാരണക്കാരാണ് അവരെല്ലാം.

ആക്രമണത്തിൽ തന്റെ പത്ത് മക്കളെയും നഷ്ടപ്പെട്ട ഒരു ഡോക്ടറുടെ വാർത്തയും കണ്ടിട്ടുണ്ട്. ബോംബിങ്ങിൽ കത്തുന്ന ടെന്റിലേക്ക്, അതിനുള്ളിലുള്ള തന്റെ മാതാവിന്റെ അടുത്തേക്ക് ഓടി കയറിയ കുഞ്ഞിന്റെ വാർത്തയുണ്ട്. നിസ്സഹായരായി മരിച്ച്കൊണ്ടിരിക്കുന്ന പ്രിയപ്പെട്ടവർക്ക് മുന്നിൽ ഒന്നും ചെയ്യാൻ കഴിയാതെ നോക്കി നിന്നവരുണ്ട്. ഓഷ്വിറ്റ്സും മറ്റു നാസി ക്യാമ്പുകളും, നേറ്റീവ് അമേരിക്കൻ വംശ ഹത്യയും, ലോക യുദ്ധങ്ങളും, എല്ലാ ആഭ്യന്തര കലാപങ്ങളും അന്താരാഷ്ട്ര യുദ്ധങ്ങളും അവർ നമ്മളെ ഓർമിപ്പിച്ചു. മനുഷ്യർ എത്ര നിസാരന്മാരാണെന്നും ജീവിതത്തിന് എത്ര വിലയുണ്ടെന്നും അവർ നമ്മളെ പഠിപ്പിച്ചു.


